May 2016 Meeting Minutes

I. Updates, announcements, any new agenda items?

- a. Discussion regarding meeting schedule – Option to change to Tuesday or Wednesday at 10:30 am - Hour and a half meeting. Carrie will explore further.

II. Review UHSC meeting and accident reports – Burkholder/Sreniawski

- a. Kermoyan discussed program for getting lab workers outfitted with lab coats. He is working on expanding the program to off-campus locations. Overview – lab coats are delivered every two weeks with two coats per person. Company provides coats and racks with name stitched into collar. Laundering will also be provided. Two coats available (regular and one fire resistant) EHS is covering costs of outfitting labs with coats. Logistics will have to be worked out for remote locations
- b. Epi Pen program - developed by UHSC. Not for people that have known allergies but rather for those not prepared for allergic reactions. One person at the site has to be trained and manage the device. Unclear as to who provides training. Cost is \$500 per kit approximately.
- c. SAIF Farm Shop Safety video – Link on CAS Safety website. Lots of good safety information on the SAIF site.

III. Action item follow-up / Old business

- a. Field Work Safety program – update – Mike S working to populate page located on EHS website. Work in progress. There are plans to link to other resources. More of a collation of existing resources to direct groups going out in the field on how to cover all aspects of safety. Policy not approved yet but moving forward. CAS SAC can provide feedback when available.

IV. New Business

- a. Swine Center OSHA - Seth has advised others to review extension cord use and to check their electrical boxes for holes. Very short notice of inspection and it went quite well. Report not yet received.
 - b. June – National Safety Month / National Safety Council – free materials available. Great opportunity to get information to employees in units regarding safety.
- Carrie still trying to put together an information card for CAS safety resources for employees.
 - First Monday of summer (June) for CFU safety training – Scott Robbins and Josh Price putting it together. Includes tractor safety, ATV safety, chemical, farm electrical, etc. Weinke would like access to materials from that session. Works in conjunction with Canvas training.
 - Seth asked if there were requirements for how many first aid and CPR trained people at a work site. No requirements unless you have an AED on site but it is highly recommended that as many employees as possible are trained, especially at remote locations.
