## Horsetail & Scouring Rush, Equisetum spp.



Identification: Perennial with dimorphic stems. Vegetative stem has whorls of fine green jointed branches. Reproductive stem is flesh colored, unbranched, with a single cone at its tip Habitat: Moist to wet forests, meadows, swamps, roadsides, areas with high water tables Animals Affected: Primarily horses Toxin family: Thiaminase; causes Vitamin B deficiency Other: Symptoms include weight loss, diarrhea and weakness, leading to immobility and death. No loss of appetite. All plant parts are poisonous. Becomes increasingly toxic when dry, in hay



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
